

## Communique of the General Education Annual Review (GEAR)

Theme: Safe re-opening of schools during COVID-19 pandemic and beyond

## 22 April 2021

#### Preamble

We, the undersigned Ministers of Education;

**Recognising** the crucial role of education in promoting peace, development and prosperity for all;

Mindful of the provisions of the Transitional Constitution of the Republic of South Sudan, 2011 (amended in 2019), Article 29, Sub-Articles (1) and (2), which state that education is a basic human right for every citizen and that the Government shall promote education at all levels;

#### Aware of

- the fact that the Republic of South Sudan has committed itself to achieving the UN Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), particularly SDG4, which focuses on ensuring an inclusive and equitable, quality education and promoting lifelong learning opportunities for all;
- the AU Continental Education Strategy for Africa 2016 2025;
- the UNESCO Adult and Youth Literacy Strategy 2020 2025;
- the Global Alliance for Literacy Strategy 2020 2025;
- 2017 Djibouti Declaration on Refugee Education;

Do hereby commit ourselves and resolve to:

- 1. **Pledge** compliance to COVID-19 preventive measures and monitoring of implementation of these measures in schools;
- Guarantee that education in South Sudan is free and compulsory and that public schools do not charge registration fees;
- Assure that schools in South Sudan reopen safely, and that WASH protocols will be enforced and enhanced;
- Dedicate efforts to support safe school reopening of schools in hard to reach areas;
- 5. Ensure that schools reopen for the Academic Year 2021/22 on 03 May 2021 and will implement 207 instruction days inclusive of in-service, school-based teacher training days, and end the Academic Year 2021/22 on 18 March 2022 as per the National Calendar for Academic Year 2021/22;
- 6. Advance (upgrade) learners to the next class through an accelerated teaching and learning;

7. Guarantee that schools will follow the New South Sudan National Curriculum, the New Assessment Framework, the New Syllabi for P1-P7

- and S1 S3 classes, and that schools will implement the old curriculum for P8 and S4;
- Express an understanding that COVID-19 school closure disproportionally impacted adolescent girls and learners living with disabilities;
- 9. Ensure that pregnant and nursing learners have access to education in all schools and that they are free to attend lessons, have access to textbooks and undertake examinations without any discrimination and with an understanding of their situation and their need for extra support to enable them to complete their education;
- 10.Permit and promote registration of learners living with disabilities in schools of their choice. Facilitate partnerships and provide support to schools in which learners with disabilities and functional difficulties are registered.
- 11. Monitor the class size and actively promote class size of up to 50/45 learners in primary and secondary schools, respectively, to enable safe learning, especially in the context of COVID-19 pandemic, and to improve quality of education;
- 12.**Improve** access to quality education for all learners, especially Out-of-School children, girls, learners with disabilities and functional difficulties, refugee, returnee and IDP learners;
- 13.Introduce State coordination mechanisms, for example, ETMC and TWGs to facilitate coordination, cooperation and monitor the implementation of the national programmes, such as improved teachers' salaries and incentives, Capitation Grants, Cash Transfers, and to enable follow-up

- 14.Implement the National Girls' Education Strategy 2018 2022;
- 15. Contribute to the development of Re-entry Policy for Pregnant and Nursing Learners;
- 16.Implement the New National School Inspection Framework;
- 17. Ensure accurate registration of schools, allocation of EMIS Codes to all schools and verification of school ownership to support implementation of programmes for schools, especially Capitation Grants, Teacher Incentives and School Feeding programmes.
- 18. Implement a National Teacher Training Strategy;
- 19.Implement a National Adult Literacy Policy;
- 20. Appeal to the National Government to increase the annual funding allocation for the General Education to more than 10% of the National Budget, commit spending of at least 45% of the budget allocation on primary education and to ensure its full execution;
- 21. **Appeal** to the National Government to regularly, and without delays, pay salaries to personnel working within the General Education sector;
- 22. Appeal to the National and State Ministries of Finance to regularly and without any delays release funds allocated for Salaries, Operational and Capitation Grants;
- 23. Advocate for improvement of pay and conditions of service for teachers at all levels by implementing the new salary structure;

24. Reduce turnover of head teachers and teachers;

- 25. Verify teacher lists and school registration data to identify ghost teachers and ghost learners and prevent irregularities and abuse of financial and inkind support for schools and learners, especially Cash Transfers, Capitation Grants and School Feeding Programmes.
- 26. Support and monitor implementation of programmes within the Alternative Education System, especially the Accelerated Learning Programme (ALP), Accelerated Secondary Education Programme (ASEP), Basic Adult Literacy Programme (BALP), Community Girls' Schools (CGS), Intensive English Course (IEC) and Pastoralist Education Programme (PEP). Support expansion of these programmes to counter the impact of the COVID-19 school closure;
- 27. Support and monitor continuation of distance learning programmes developed to assure access to education for moving and Out-of-School communities and to support access to learning for all during school closures caused by COVID-19, insecurity, and natural disasters;
- 28. Implement TVET Policy, the National TVET Qualification Framework, and TVET Quality Assurance Framework;
- 29. Establish TVET centres of excellence and develop new TVET courses to improve skills and increase opportunities for youth, especially in post-COVID-19 context:
- 30. Supervise the conduct and delivery of the national examinations and assure access to the examinations for pregnant and nursing learners and learners with disabilities and functional difficulties:
